

## **Services for Seniors**

### **Adult Day Care**

Supervised daytime program for disabled adults and frail elderly who benefit from nursing care, counseling, and social activities.

### **Caregiver Counseling**

Counseling to caregivers to assist them in making decisions and problem-solving.

### **Case Management Program**

Social work assistance to frail elderly; coordinates in-home services.

### **Chronic Disease Self-Management Program**

An interactive 6-week workshop for seniors with chronic health conditions and their caregivers.

### **EnhanceFitness**

An evidence-based, physical activity program designed to improve the overall functional fitness and well-being of older adults.

### **Elderly Nutrition Services**

Hot lunches at various congregate meal sites and island-wide home-delivered meals to homebound seniors.

### **Friendly Visiting Program**

Friendly visits by volunteers to frail elderly.

### **Grandparents Raising Grandchildren**

Family caregivers (grandparents) have supportive programs and services that address their needs to enable them to continue giving care.

### **Home Service Registry**

Referral of in-home workers who provide services for a fee.

### **Homemaker Services**

Helping frail seniors with housework, meal preparation and other limited in-home services.

### **Information and Referral**

Information on senior resources and referral or linkage to appropriate agencies; community outreach to provide information about available services.

### **Kupuna Care Transportation**

Bus service available for registered seniors to and from program activities, for shopping, clinic and recreation; Kupuna Care transportation (door-to-door) services for frail elderly.

### **Legal Assistance Services**

Legal education, counseling and referral in Medicaid, Medicare, landlord-tenant, creditor, family law and other legal matters. Limited document preparation.

### **Personal Care**

Assistance with activities of daily living such as bathing, dressing, grooming, and eating, under the direction of a medical professional.

### **Respite Services**

Provides caregiver relief by assisting in the supervision and care of frail elderly.

### **Senior Companion Program**

Program-qualified senior volunteers provide companionship and assistance to frail, homebound older adults.

### **Senior Identification Card**

Photo I.D. available to persons 60 years and older.

### **Telephone Reassurance**

Telephone contact by volunteers to isolated elderly.

### **Volunteer Program**

Meaningful volunteer opportunities for persons 55 years and older.

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### **Eligibility**

Older adults 60 years and older. Priority is given to those in greatest financial and social need. Eligibility for some services may require an inability to perform one or more physical, self care or go-outside-the home activities.

### **Voluntary Contributions**

Older adults and their families have the opportunity to make a contribution towards the services they receive, thus helping to maintain and expand services within each program.

### **Funders**

Funds for the Agency on Elderly Affairs Senior Services are provided by the County of Kauai, Federal Administration on Aging, and State of Hawai'i, through the State Executive Office on Aging.
